Light refreshments will be provided.

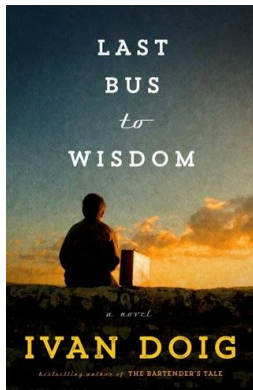


Holiday Pie Sale
